Objective(s):

Students begin to string words together to read a short adapted sentence.

Introduction:

- Theme = picnics
- Teacher will ask students what book they have been reading for the last week.
 - The Very Hungry Caterpillar
- Caterpillar likes to eat so we are going to write about what we like to eat.

Body:

- Have students request turns to complete their sentence in the chart.
- "I like to eat _____." or "My favorite food is _____."
- Have a bunch of different food props for students to choose their favorite food.
- Once students trace or write their answer in the space.

Closing:

- Using a pointer, read the predictable sentences together as a class.
- Clap out sentences
- "Tomorrow we will review our sentences and chop them up! We will see if we can put them back together again."

Accommodations:
